The cost of the meal is evenly divided by the number who sign-up to eat so it will vary from week to week. *Twilight Golf is a great way to introduce prospective members to the club. People do not have to be a member to play Twilight as long as they are playing with members.*

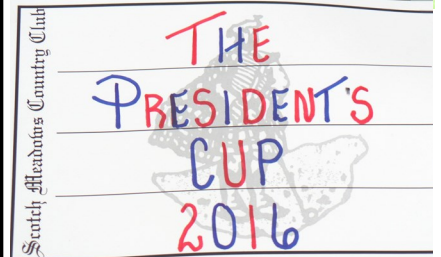

The Walsh Report

All golf courses across the United States are struggling to make ends meet. Scotch Meadows Country Club's Board of Directors have had to make some tough decisions in recent years to make sure our club survives during this economic downturn.

During the last 5 years I have basically worked with the same budget, regardless of inflation and increases in my product costs. This year will be even more challenging because I have been asked to reduce my budget by \$20,000. To accomplish this, I have had no choice but to reduce labor costs. In the past few years, I have had 3 fulltime employees working on the golf course and then utilized part-time help based on seasonal needs or weather related "emergencies." This year I will have to maintain the course with only 2 fulltime employees and part-time help as needed. At the very least, I am reducing my labor by a third.

My goal is to keep maintenance levels the same for greens, tees and fairways. However, I must reduce labor somewhere and that will show in areas that are out of normal play and in the rough areas. Your cooperation and understanding of our situation will be needed. Please, let me know if there are things that you feel should be taken care of. My assessment of what is necessary might vary from what members think, but keep in mind that I am going to have to "pick and choose" what I have time to accomplish.

As always, you can help; fixing ball marks, filling divots with sand on tees, fairways and rough, raking sand traps, and driving carts on cart paths wherever possible go a long way in helping us maintain the golf course. Overcoming challenges requires patience, persistence and perseverance. You can only steer your way through challenges if you persevere and show your strength of character in such hard and nerve wrecking times.

I would like to recognize individuals and groups that have routinely helped us out through the years. Their commitment to our course and employees is appreciated. Members of the Ladies' Golf Association take turns bringing lunch or breakfast for our staff. We are very grateful, thank-you! There are several groups or individuals that have volunteered to "adopt" a hole on the golf course. They pick up sticks, pine cones and trash, pull weeds, fill divots, etc., etc..., your efforts are appreciated. Thanks to Burt Dean, Joe Williams, Mark Murphy, Dean Nichols, Tommy Brigman, Gary Dwyer, Jay Barber, Randy Graves, Ed Wright, Terry Graves, Frank Callahan, Beth Elliott, John Massey, Charles Todd, Richard Wentworth, Fred Mabry and anyone else I may have missed. I would also like to thank BJ and James Clark for their assistance and equipment whenever we need it.
