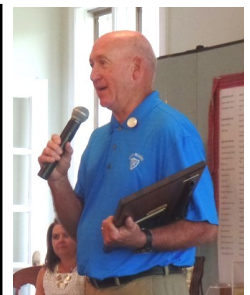

Scotch Meadows Swimming Pool News

Our Club Swimming Pool is scheduled to open on Friday, May 27th and is for the enjoyment of Scotch Meadows members and their invited guests. All guests must be accompanied by a member and must obtain a guest pass in the golf shop before entering the pool area. In-town guests are required to pay a \$10 per person daily fee. There is no fee for an out-of-town guest. Guest passes should be given to the lifeguard on duty when entering the pool area.

Hours of Operation

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday: 10:00 am - 7:00 pm

Thursday: 10:00 am - 8:00 pm; Sunday: 1:00 pm - 7:00 pm

Please Note: Until school dismisses for the summer, the pool will open at 3:30 on weekdays.

Pool Rentals for Parties

The Scotch Meadows swimming pool can be booked by SMCC members for private parties after our regular daily pool hours. The cost is \$75 for 25 or less people attending, \$100 for 26-75 people attending and \$125 for over 75 people. At the renter's expense, a Scotch Meadow's lifeguard must be on duty the entire time of the rental, at a cost of \$7.50 per hour with a minimum of \$20.00. The renter should pay the lifeguard directly on the night of the party. Groups of 75 or more require two lifeguards. The renter may ask a specific guard to cover the party, or we can assign a guard for you. Pool rentals are booked through the golf shop.

Pool Memberships Now Available!!

Summer Pool Memberships will be available for this year on a trial basis. The membership costs \$499.00, payable at the beginning of the season and must be paid in full prior to pool use. Pool Memberships are not available to current SMCC members. Please "pass the word" to friends as this will be a great way to keep our yearly membership dues and assessments from increasing.

Did you see the SMCC LOGO on National TV?

Janet Smith, wife of member, Greg Wood, appeared in the Golf Channel's "86," a documentary about Jack Nicklaus's 1986 Masters Victory. It aired on April 5, just prior to this year's tournament. Janet, and her mother, Mary Lou Smith, were interviewed along with many others about their connection to Jack & the amazing "come from behind" win.

Janet's older brother, Craig, developed a friendship with Jack in 1969 when Craig was eleven years old and suffering from cancer. Craig was an avid golfer, but as the disease progressed, he was unable to play. Like all of us, he enjoyed watching Jack play on television. Jack would call or write periodically and visit when in town. During one call, Craig told Jack that he had won because Craig was wearing his "lucky yellow shirt" for him. Jack then wore yellow shirts on Sundays as a way to say "hello" to Craig, knowing that he was watching. Craig died in 1971 at thirteen.

While dressing for the final round of the 1986 Masters, Jack decided to wear the "lucky yellow shirt" again. And that final round is a part of golf history. Jack's yellow shirt that day was a wonderful tribute to his friendship with Craig and salute to the champion and person Jack Nicklaus is.

Thank you Janet for intentionally wearing something with our logo the day she was filmed. The show has aired several more times since April 5th.
